Charter a boat for a dinner cruise along the River Vltava and marvel at the multitude of monuments and statues along the way. With a thousand-year history and breathtaking scale, qualifying it as the largest ancient castle in the world, Prague Castle is the indisputable centrepiece of the Czech Republic.

No matter how long or short a tour you can manage, you will never be short of things to do and see in this historical capital. And with Good King Wenceslas as its patron saint, perhaps a winter visit combined with the Christmas Markets would be just what your class needs for added motivation over the festive period.
